# On the Human Relations Commission

Realtor says she's determined to stand up for the rights of others.

Virginia Han knows what it's like to be bullied, to be non-confrontational and to be fearful of retaliation.

She knows, and she won't stand for such behavior.

Han, who was appointed by Fourth District Supervisor Chris Norby to the Orange County Human Relations Commission last month, said she looks forward to helping people stand up for their rights and be heard.

The Fullerton Realtor easily recalled an incident with her younger sister in their native Korea that helped determine her sympathetic path.

"My little sister was walking along when this older boy came up and hit her," Han said. "She was crying, and all my parents told her to do was to come in and eat dinner.

"But I wanted the boy's parents to know what he had done, so I marched my sister to their house and told her to cry harder," Han said. "Eventually, he had to apologize under pressure from his family."

Han expects similarities in her new position.

"Many immigrants have a high education, but they're still afraid to say anything," she said. "Many times the problem is overcoming language and culture."
